Course Description:

This course provides an introduction to the research and theories related to animal and human behavior. The course will address a broad understanding of psychological theories and will lay the foundation for future coursework in psychology. Topics to be covered include: learning, memory, motivation, emotions, personality, the biology of thought and behavior, social psychology, human development, psychological disorders and therapies. The class will be in lecture format but attendance and participation are expected.

1. Recognize/identify the major theories, concepts and perspectives in the field of psychology.

2. Identify and apply elements of scientific method.

3. Distinguish between general research strategies and identify advantages and disadvantages of each.

4. Identify the basic structure and functioning of the brain and nervous system.

5. Apply psychological theories, concepts and values to demonstrate awareness of selfand others.

Participation:

This is an online course. You are expected to check to our online course room a few times a week. You can expect for me to reply to you within 48 hours during the week. Below are the instructions for accessing the online course room:
